



Dr. Angeli E. Weller

As both a strategist and researcher, Dr. Angeli Weller is a passionate advocate for integrity, inclusivity, and innovation in business and the capital markets. She consults and researches worldwide on ethics, social impact and innovation strategies through her firm, Weller Worldwide. Angeli's areas of expertise include strategy and business model innovation for companies committed to improving their social and environmental impacts; impact measurement and reporting across material economic, social and environmental indicators, including integrated reporting practices; and business ethics, ethical decision making, and building ethical cultures in organizations from start-ups to multinationals.

Angeli excels at the intersection of ethics, impact and innovation, and her current research focus on the ethics of innovation and the ethics of social impact. Her research has been published in journals such as *Business and Society* and *Organizational Dynamics*.

Angeli was previously the national Director of Ethics at KPMG, where she served for more than a decade as a company-wide resource on issues of ethics, corporate responsibility and risk management. She was a key member of the team that created and launched KPMG's first US and global ethics programs in a post-Enron, post-Arthur Anderson world where nothing was clear but the need for change.

Angeli has worked across the private, nonprofit and higher education sectors over the course of her career, always in a start-up capacity, and she has developed a unique expertise in launching new programs and facilitating cross sector partnerships to catalyze systems change around entrenched social issues. Angeli recently designed a social innovation strategy and curriculum for a major branch of the United Nations seeking to re-envision how to better protect human rights around the world. She also built and fundraised for a \$1.5 million transaction inspired by a pay for success strategy that scales an evidence-based early literacy intervention proven to result in more public school children reading at grade level benchmarks. Additionally, she was the founding director of the Responsible Business Initiative (RBI) at Boise State University, which was recognized by the UN for producing one of the top three new business school sustainability reports in the world. In the late 1990s, Angeli began her career as the program officer for a roundtable that brought global business and human rights leaders together to find areas of common interest at a time when collaboration between the sectors was uncommon, to say the least.

Angeli holds a PhD from Copenhagen Business School, where she was a fellow in the Center for Corporate Social Responsibility researching at the intersection of business ethics, social responsibility and organizational learning in a global context. She also has an MBA from Cambridge University, and an AB with honors in international relations from Mount Holyoke College.

Angeli serves on the board of directors for the Saint Alphonsus Hospital Foundation, and the board of advisors for GoodWell, a cross-sector certification that seeks to raise the floor on what it means to be a responsible organization. She is also the founder of the Earthpaw Innovation Award given to non-profits pursuing creative and sustainable solutions to animal welfare concerns.
